General Cabinet Responsibilities

1. Be available as a resource for information about Judaism, Jewish Identity and Israel for other NFTYites
2. Make outreach calls before events
3. Maintain a strong, positive, and creative work ethic
4. Have strong communication skills with the elected RCVP and other members of the cabinet

Positions and Position-Specific Responsibilities and Requirements

Service Leading Team

1. Help to create, write, and/or lead Friday and Saturday Shabbat services
2. Be willing to read and/or find someone willing to read torah for the Saturday morning service
3. Have a positive attitude and get creative with ideas for new kinds of services

Israel Engagement Team

1. Help create Israel-centered programs
2. Provide honest, unbiased information about Israel for anyone who is interested
3. Help to lead and moderate productive discussions and activities centered around Israel
4. Be aware that Israel programming is often a sensitive topic, and should always be discussed unbiasedly and with no personal opinions

Jewish Culture Team

1. Work closely with other cabinets to incorporate Judaism into all aspects of an event
2. Help to create and lead programs centered around Jewish culture
 - a. Examples: Torah improv optional mandatory, Israeli dance flash mobs during meals, etc.
3. Be able to implement Jewish values into cultural programming
